Dear Ken,

Thank you for your help the other day.

Tonewear Limited (yet another bulldog company) has at last registered your assignment at the patent office and I have ordered a copy.

Bulldog claims that it bestows on them everyone's full title, full interest and full benefit and that because there is no mention of obligations therein, they have it lock stock and barrel and don't have to pay royalties. Both you and I know that this is an exaggeration of the extent of the interest that an administrator will assign.

I therefore need a separate letter to file at the patent office to make it clear that the administrator has not set aside any unmentioned obligations or rights.

I enclose a letter which clarified just this same point with regard to the liquidator's assignment to sense-sonic in 2001 for your reference.
