25 The “Patent Rights” included the patents included in A1. A2 recited the original agreement to assign but made no mention of A1.

30 A2 was in due course signed by both parties, thus complying with s. 30(6). The second party to sign did so on 1st September 1992. The document was presented to the Stamp Office for adjudication. There was no formal adjudication though the Stamp Office could have required that procedure. The Office accepted the valuation of £54,000. This led to a duty of £540 which was paid and the document was stamped accordingly. It was then presented (with some delay, irrelevant in this application) to the Patent Office with the relevant forms by letter of 1st October 1992. The Patent Office recorded A2 on the register. In the
